

# Per the L1000 Policy File:

The Environmental Committee shall oversee the implementation of a coordinated environmental and environmental justice program consistent with Local 1000 policy and all applicable provisions of contracts in force. The committee shall also make any needed recommendations to the Local 1000 Board of Directors and/or the Local 1000 statewide officers.

- (b) To identify environmental and environmental justice issues of particular concern and to support Local 1000 and its individual members in taking collective action on these issues through the committee's leadership roles in encouraging more educated, prepared, and environmentally conscious members.






# Goals and Objectives



# How to get involved with the EC

- "Like: the EC public Facebook Page, read it, engage in dialogues on posts, add your own posts
- ❖ Search for and ask to "join" the EC Activist Forum: this is where you will interact directly with the EC Team and activists. The majority of all written EC communications take place in this format, in this forum. Essentially, if you want to be involved you need to have a Facebook account. It's free, and we will help you learn how to use it, if you need.
- ❖ Become a subject matter expert (SME) for particular issues/subjects of your preference and then become the point of contact (POC) on said issues/subjects for the EC (e.g. one of the EC activists is a SME and POC for fracking in Monterey County and Measure Z).
- ❖ Take on a task and be its caretaker (e.g. one person is maintaining the Legislative bills list we created).
- ❖ Get involved in local events on behalf of the EC (e.g. the 2018 March for Science L.A., coastal/river clean-ups, etc.....)
