Also includes updated guidance related to testing, source control, resident transfers, and staffing shortages in California

<b>Addressing supply and staffing shortages</b>

CDC <a href="#">Strategies for Optimizing the Supply of PPE</a> (follow and read all links for <b>each PPE type</b> )	Guidance for HCP to optimize options for PPE use during supply shortages, including contingency strategies to help stretch PPE when shortages are anticipated, for example if facilities have sufficient supplies now but are likely to run out soon and crisis strategies during severe PPE shortages. Emphasizes as PPE become available, facilities should promptly resume standard practices. Includes separate strategies for each PPE type including respirators, facemasks, isolation gowns, and eye protection
17. CDC <a href="#">PPE Burn Rate Calculator</a>	Crucial tool for facilities to track daily PPE use, calculate number of days of available supplies, and plan for ordering supplies. Allows facility to detect changes in usage and alter ordering strategies before supplies run too low
